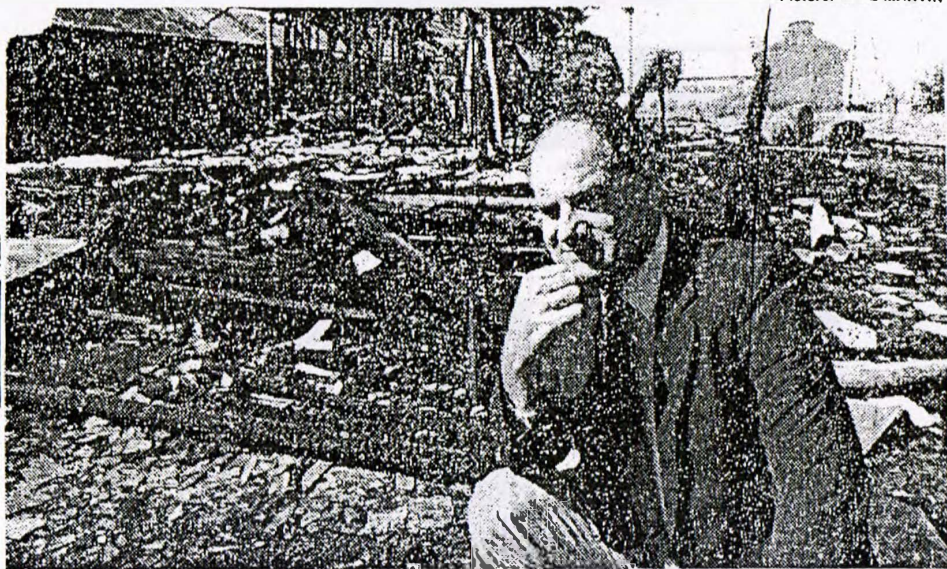
1. Plane used for squaring chimes.

Mr Edwards at the Spotswood pumping station yesterday. He was "appalled" by damage caused by fire to a building behind the station.

State Government plans to build a \$13 million science and technology museum at the old pumping station in Spotswood have been thrown into doubt.

The Museum of Victoria has refused to sign a lease agreement with the owner, the Board of Works, because it claims security at the site is lacking.

The museum says the 90-year-old building has been vandalised in the past month. Most of the windows in the handsome pumping station — built in the French classical style — have been

smashed. Early yesterday fire destroyed a wooden building at the back.

The director of the museum, Mr Robert Edwards, inspected the damage and said he was appalled.

Mr Edwards would not comment on a museum council meeting on Wednesday that decided to

refuse to sign a lease agreement to take over responsibility for the building. The president of the council, Mr Ray Marginson, is also the chairman of the Board of Works.

A spokesman for the board said there was "a low level of security" at the pumping station. "At the moment it is an unmanned site."

A spokesman for the Minister for the Arts, Mr Walker, said last night that the museum had enough money to "secure the Spotswood site, both physically and with personnel". Museum staff staff denied this.
